#### Attendance

#### 1. How do I confirm my attendance?

#### 4. What sort of format does the seminar follow?

The *Re-Thinking Virtue In the Contemporary World* seminar offers both introductory and advanced sessions. A schedule of plenary and track sessions allows participants to concentrate on areas most relevant to their own interest, studies, and practice.

#### 5. How many people will be at the seminar?

The *Re-Thinking Virtue In the Contemporary World* seminar will host up to 50 participants.

**6. What is the dress attire?**

The attire for all seminar sessions is business casual. However, for the opening and closing events, the attire is business: gentlemen: jacket and tie, suit optional; ladies: business dress, skirt ensemble, or dress pants.

Participants will have access to the Finnegan Fieldhouse gym, so you may want to bring sportswear if you would like to use those facilities.

**7. How should I arrange my travels?**

Please submit your travel information via our online form as soon as possible.

Please plan to arrive at the seminar before the close of check-in (12:00pm-5:30PM on July 5).

\*Note: Book flights which land **before 5:00PM** to allow time for travel to campus from the airport. Participants are welcome on campus outside of these parameters, (see FAQs 9 and 15) but rooms will be unavailable. Luggage storage will be provided.

**8. Is there transportation to and from the Pittsburgh airport to Franciscan campus?**

We will have a shuttle service running between the airport and campus for seminar participants, a 25 minute drive. Please check your emails a few days prior to the seminar for your shuttle pick up time.

**9. What if my flight is delayed?**

As long as your flight details (including flight number, area of departure, arrival time, and departure time) are relayed to the Coordinator, the transportation team will have that information and will be able to track your flight. Further, transportation staff will be given your phone number to call if there are any problems.

**10. Where should I park?**

If you are driving, please pull up to campus via the main entrance (it is clearly marked). There will be directions at the first stop sign at the top of the hill to assist you.

**11. Can I arrive early and/or leave early and/or leave late?**

Unfortunately, we are unable to provide housing for those arriving or leaving early. However, we do have a block of rooms reserved at the Inn at Franciscan Square for a discounted rate. Please mention the Hildebrand Seminar when booking. Please make your reservations as soon as possible. While we understand that participants may have compelling reasons to leave early, we highly encourage you to attend the full seminar. The closing banquet brings participants together

for one final (and memorable) evening of testimonials from fellow participants and the chance to enjoy good food and conversation with friends made over the course of the week.

## **Accommodations**

### **12. What kind of accommodations are available?**

Each participant is given a private room in university housing for the duration of the seminar. Men and women are housed in separate hallways with separate bathrooms. The dormitories do have air conditioning and free wifi access.

### **13. What are the bathroom facilities like?**

Bathrooms and shower facilities in the dormitories are communal (separate for men and women) and it will be necessary to walk a short distance down the hallway to use the facilities.

### **14. Should I bring my own towel/hangers/sheet/etc?**

We will provide you with a towel, bedding (sheets, light blanket, and pillow), and hangers at check-in. There will also be access to an iron and ironing board.

### **15. What is Franciscan University of Steubenville (FUS) and where is it?**

FUS is a Catholic university that was founded in the small town of Steubenville, Ohio by TOR Franciscan Friars in 1946. Franciscan University remains one of the most respected Catholic universities in the United States. Since 2001, U.S. News & World Report's guidebook on "America's Best Colleges" has ranked Franciscan University in the elite "top tier" of Midwestern universities.

Steubenville is located near the the eastern border of Ohio, a short distance from the city of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. For more information on FUS, visit their [website](#).

### **16. What is there to do during free time?**

Participants are invited to visit the bookstore, borrow books from the John Paul II Library, grab a coffee or snack in the JC Williams Center, Brooklyn Bagel, or Rubi's Pizza, workout in the Finnegan Fieldhouse gym, relax in the dormitory, and/or visit any of the following sacred sites: The Portiuncula, Tomb of the Unborn Child, Marian Grotto, Stations of the Cross, Christ the King Chapel. You will be provided with a map of the campus and hours of operation for all of the above at check-in.

### **17. Is mass available?**

There is daily mass available on campus in Christ the King chapel at 12:05pm. Sunday mass will be celebrated at 10:00 AM.

**18. Can the seminar accommodate allergies and/or special dietary requirements?**

Yes, we would be happy to take care of your dietary needs. We simply ask for notification when you confirm your acceptance to the seminar.

**19. Is there internet access?**

Free WiFi is widely available on campus, including the dormitories, John Paul II Library, and the JC Williams Center. Access instructions will be given upon arrival.

**20. Do dormitories have air conditioning?**

Yes, each room has a heating and cooling unit located near the door from which the temperature may be adjusted.

**21. Can I bring my spouse?**

Due to the nature of our housing, we are unable to accommodate couples.
